

Forty Hours Adoration: June 1-3, 2017

Continuing our Parish tradition of the Forty Hours Devotion, we will gather together again this year to celebrate forty hours of adoration, asking that The Lord may continue to extend His mercy and blessings upon us.

In this spirit of devotion to the Blessed Sacrament, we are inviting parishioners to pledge at least one hour of adoration and to **return their sign-up sheet by May 28th**

Everyone is welcome to visit the Blessed Sacrament at any time during the Forty Hours, but we need at least two people committed to each hour to ensure that the Blessed Sacrament is never left alone.

Hours in the middle of the night are especially difficult to fill, and so we are in particular need of anyone who might be willing to dedicate themselves to these hours.

There will be no change to the daily Mass schedule during the Forty Hours. However there will be the addition of one Mass at 7 p.m. on the Feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus (Friday June 2). This Mass in the Presence of the Blessed Sacrament will be celebrated according to the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite (Traditional Latin Mass).

As we recall Christ’s request in St. Matthew’s Gospel (26:40) that his Apostles remain watchful with him for one hour in the Garden of Gethsemane (“Could you not watch with me for one hour?”), let us pray that God may bestow many graces on us during our time spent in Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.
